A particular riding highlight is the Appalachian Byway, which crosses Moble County along SR 78.



Southeastern Ohio should be on every motorcyclist's destination list. The rural two-lane roads winding through farms, hills, and woods make for peaceful, relaxing tours.

Noble County, with its county seat in Caldwell, is an ideal location to break away from the hustle and bustle of the city. Only a short ride from Marietta, Noble County is filled with winding roads, pristine nature, fascinating historical sites, local eateries, and much more. Whether you're out on a day, weekend, or a whole week's tour, Noble County will keep you entertained the entire time.

If you manage to exhaust Noble County, the Appalachian Byway (SR 78) stretching through the area takes you to the neighboring Monroe and Morgan Counties as well. Explore the Wayne National Forest in Monroe County or ride through historical structures on Morgan County's Covered Bridge Trail.

THE LEAF TOUR

Approximately 155 miles

The scenery along the Leaf Tour alternates between peaceful farmland and Ohio's gorgeous woods. Starting southward, the trees come first, then the farms, until a stint on the famous Triple Nickel (SR 555) plunges you straight back into the forest. This route is a meandering, beautiful ride-especially in the fall when the trees burst into all shades of yellow, red, and orange. Toward the end of the ride, you'll pass some great spots for birdwatching near The Wilds, alongside a USS Shenandoah crash site.

Directions (Clockwise)

- From Caldwell take SR 821 S toward Dexter City
- Turn right on SR 339
- Turn right on SR 676
- Turn left on Brownrigg Rd/CR 6 • Turn right on SR 550
- Turn right on SR 555 (The Triple Nickel)
- Turn right on SR 669 • In McConnelsville, turn left on SR 376
- Turn right on SR 60
- In Duncan Falls, turn right on Millers Ln/CR 73
- Turn right on SR 146

- Turn right on SR 284
- Turn left on SR 78

THE BIG MUSKIE TOUR

Approximately 154 miles

The Big Muskie Tour takes you northwest from Caldwell on a relaxing outing. There are fewer curves, but that only gives you more time to admire the countryside—including orchards that allow you to pick your own fruit—and all the small towns you'll pass by and through. Befitting this tour's name, the final leg in Morgan County takes you by the Big Muskie Bucket, which is a must-see along this route. This tour is your window to the calm life in rural southwestern Ohio.

Directions (Counterclockwise)

- From Caldwell take SR 821 N
- Turn left on SR 313
- Turn right on SR 83
- Turn left on Norfield Rd/CR 20 • Straight on New Hope Rd
- Turn left on SR 93 • In Adamsville, turn right on SR 208
- In Dresden, turn left on Main St, which turns into SR 60
- Turn right on Shannon Rd/CR 48
- Turn left on Shannon Valley Rd Turn right on SR 146
- Turn left on SR 16
- Turn left on Brownsville Rd SE/CR 668 at the stop light • In Brownsville, continue on SR 668
- Turn right on US 22
- At the traffic circle, take the third exit onto SR 13 • In New Lexington, take a right on W Broadway St/SR 13
- Stay straight on E Broadway St
- Turn right on Carroll St • Turn left on Wilbren Rd/Tunnel Hill Rd
- Turn left on SR 93
- Turn right on SR 669 • In McConnelsville, take the third traffic circle exit, cross
- the river, then take the first traffic circle exit Turn left on SR 78

THE HOCKING TOUR

Approximately 172 miles

Explore • Discover • Visit

Get ready for some curves! The Hocking Tour takes you through Noble and Morgan Counties to the Hocking River and Federal Creek, offering a wonderful riding experience as you meander on narrow two-lane roads. Immerse vourself in the vibrant greenery (or orange-ry, depending on when you ride) of the Wayne National Forest. The famous Hocking Hills State Park isn't far if you want to deviate a bit from the route. North of Chauncey, you also have a chance to ride through the historical Kidwell Covered Bridge.

Directions (Clockwise)

- From Caldwell, take SR 821 S
- Turn right on SR 339
- In Beverly, turn right on SR 60 • Turn left on SR 266
- Turn left on SR 792
- Straight on SR 676
- Straight on CR 6/Brownrigg Rd • Turn left on SR 550
- In Barlow, turn right on SR 339
- Turn right on CR 3/Veto Rd
- Turn left on SR 555
- Turn right on US 50
- Turn right on SR 144 • In Stewart, turn right on SR 329
- Turn left on SR 550
- Turn right on SR 13
- In Chauncey, turn right to stay on SR 13
- Turn right on SR 78



THE DEMON'S TRIANGLE TOUR

Approximately 180 miles

Be prepared to test your mettle as your head southeast from Caldwell into Monroe County. This tour takes you to the titular Demon's Triangle, one of the most challenging motorcycling routes in Ohio. A particular highlight is SR 536, also known as the Demon's Backbone—and his back is a crooked one. Don't let this tour's ominous name scare you off, though. Skirting the Ohio River, the Demon's Triangle Tour is a thrilling, curvy ride through Monroe County's gorgeous woods. Just a short ride off the route is also the breathtaking Kiedaisch Point Park, which offers a view over the Ohio River you shouldn't miss.

- From Caldwell, take SR 78 E
- Turn right on SR 564
- Turn left on SR 145 • Turn right on SR 260
- Turn left on SR 7
- Turn left on SR 800
- Turn right on SR 255
- Turn left on SR 7
- Turn left on SR 536
- Turn right on SR 78
- Turn left on SR 7
- Turn left on SR 556 • In Beallsville, turn right on Main St/SR 145
- Turn left on SR 148
- Turn left on SR 26/New Castle Rd • In Woodsfield, turn right on SR 78



THE LAKES TOUR

Approximately 185 miles

There are few things as soothing as riding along stunning waterscapes. The aptly named Lakes Tour stretches northeast of Noble County, leading you to see Tappan, Clendening, Piedmont, and Senecaville lakes. Before you reach them, though, you get to experience a roller-coaster ride through hilly and rural small-town Ohio. Give a friendly wave to the horses and cows that graze on the green hillsides. You might even see some wilder creatures as you roll by Egypt Valley Wildlife Area.

Directions (Counterclockwise)

- From Caldwell, take SR 78 E
- Turn right on SR 260
- Turn left on SR 724
- Turn left on SR 145
- In Lewisville, turn right on SR 78 • In Woodsfield, turn left on Main St, then turn left on
- SR 800/Oaklawn Ave
- Turn right on SR 145 • Turn right on SR 148
- Turn left on SR 9 • In Cadiz, turn right on SR 9/US 250
- Turn left on SR 151
- In Scio, turn left on Main St, then left on SR 646
- Turn left on US 250 • Turn right on Deersville Rd/CR 55
- Turn left on Mallarnee Rd/CR 21 (turns into SR 799)
- Turn right on SR 799
- Turn left on SR 800 Turn left on US 22
- Turn right on SR 331
- In Flushing, straight on SR 149
- Turn right on US 40 • Turn left on W Cross St/CR 26
- Turn right on SR 147 Straight on SR 265
- In Quaker City, turn left on SR 513
- Turn right on SR 147

1. Ohio Amish Country The Ohio Amish Country's heartland is within an hour's ride from Noble County. Around Millersburg, you can immerse yourself in a peaceful rural setting, populated by humble, hardworking, and-above all-friendly people. Make a detour off the Basket Tour to visit the Amish Country's unique stores and sample the delicious heri-



2. Motorcyclist Memorial

The Fallen Motorcyclist Memorial in Hopedale commemorates those whose ride ended too soon. Upon its dedication in 1993, the Motherstone—the memorial's central black granite stone—was flanked by two stone slabs inscribed with the names of fallen riders. Today, the columns of names stretch for several hundred feet. The memorial is easily reachable on the Lakes Tour.

3. Home Towner Cafe

Welcome to your home away from home. Home Towner Cafe serves delicious home-style meals. The varied menu features everything from sweet and savory pies to roast dinners, steak, pork chops, and more for a delicious lunch on the Lakes Tour. Just like grandma used to make!



4. The Wilds

The Wilds is a non-profit safari park that makes for an exciting experience for visitors of all ages. The open-air tours going through the park let you see endangered, exotic animals, from the humble American burying beetle to cheetahs and giraffes. Other activities include birdwatching, ziplining, horseback riding, and more.

5. USS Shenandoah Memorial

USS Shenandoah, commissioned in 1923, was the first of four U.S. Navy rigid airships. Only two years later, a thunderstorm burst its gas bags and broke the ship apart. The USS Shenandoah Memorial commemorates the tragic accident. The three crash sites each also feature a smaller

6. Historic Beallsville Diner

The Historic Beallsville Diner is a great place to grab something tasty to eat during your ride in Monroe County. This quaint pizzeria serves much more than just Italian pies. On the changing menus, you'll find treats such as roast beef dinners, baked chicken, pasta, and much

7. Cherry Orchards

Cherry Orchards in Crooksville makes for a fantastic stop to stock up on fresh, homegrown fruits, berries, flowers, and vegetables. The orchard offers pick-your-own visits and also hosts farmers' markets where you can sample the best produce Ohio has to offer.

8. The Boondocks BBQ & Grill Enjoy mouthwatering barbecue and grilled meats surrounded by beautiful scenery at the cozy Boondocks BBQ & Grill. Opened in 2007, it didn't take long for everyone in Morgan County to realize why Boondock's barbecue wins awards. As their slogan states, it's just that darn good!

9. Big Muskie Bucket

Big Muskie was the largest dragline excavator ever built. This enormous behemoth could lift 325 tons of earth—in a single "bite." Big Muskie was just too big to preserve after its decommissioning in 1999, but its bucket remains as a reminder of one of the biggest pieces of machinery in human history.

10. Appalachian Byway of Ohio

The Appalachian Byway stretches through Noble, Morgan, Athens, and Monroe Counties. This 105-mile road is your gateway to calm, rolling Appalachian foothills in peaceful Ohio countryside. All tours on this map share a stretch on the Byway, but it's absolutely worth tackling on its own





11. Historic Jail Museum

The Historic Iail in Caldwell, built in 1882, is a rare example of a jail that housed both the prisoners and the jailer under the same roof. Today, displays in the building showcase the history of both the jail and the wider Noble County. The Historic Jail Museum is conveniently located in Caldwell's historical downtown.

12. Kidwell Covered Bridge

The Kidwell Covered Bridge spans Sunday Creek between Chauncey and Jacksonville. This 70-foot-long Howe truss covered bridge, built in 1880, was named after the Kidwell family who operated a nearby mill. The bridge is open to traffic and motorcycles can ride through it.
